Ring-neck Duck Monarch Butterfly

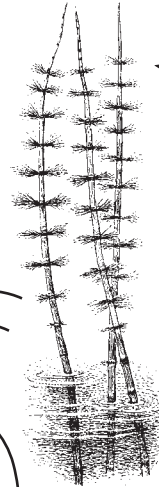
Ring-neck ducks have a faint brown ring around their black necks.

Horsetail is poisonous to cattle but not to humans.

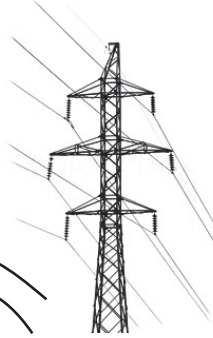


Ringo's House at the pond.

The wind blows you off course.



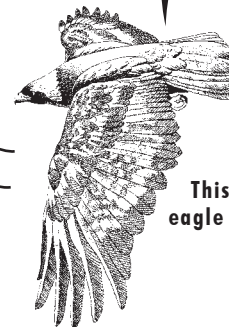
Monarch butterflies only lay eggs on milkweed and monarch caterpillars only eat milkweed.



Mona's House in the milkweed garden.



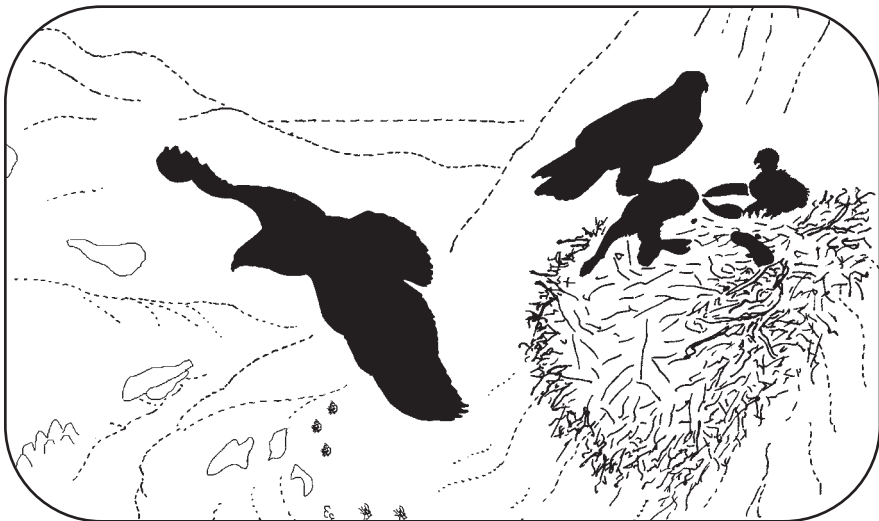
Fly around the building.
